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

Inception Workshop



Purpose of SADC TFCA Network:

To overcome TFCA challenges through purpose shared learning, knowledge management and collaboration

Functions of the Network:

1. Information exchange:

- Sharing experiences within and across TFCAs
- Conducting field visits to enhance understanding of local contexts

2. Joint learning and knowledge management:

- Developing a portal as a platform for joint learning, information exchange and knowledge management for SADC TFCA Network members
- Developing a <u>regional</u> repository of TFCA related information
- Innovation and idea testing through joint experimentation and documentation
- Knowledge product development
- Enabling peer review and feedback

3. Resource mobilisation


4. Strengthening collaboration and relationships:

- Facilitating empowerment at the level of the TFCA




This session:

Proposed Membership & Governance Arrangements

MEMBERSHIP

Steering Committee

16 ppl - 1 from each MS + SADC Sec. Chaired as per Troika

Open to all - SADC MS & all stakeholder groups

Steering Committee responsible for:

- Setting priorities and determining the strategic direction
- Prioritising linkages to other stakeholder groups;
- Leading by example in their active engagement
- Attending periodic face-to-face meetings
- Considering requests for membership
- Facilitating the resolution of any disputes amongst members
- Consideration of calls for revocation of membership based on sound reasoning
- Reporting to & advising SADC TC on Wildlife on key recommendations and activities of the Network.

Membership Process



Clear Caveat:

The SADC Member States, through the Steering Committee, ultimately reserve the right of membership to the SADC TFCA Network.

All Members will be entitled to:

- Access information shared on the open access levels of the portal
- Attend Network meetings
- Share TFCA related information on the portal with other members
- Participate in open discussions on the portal
- Recommend new members to the Network
- Call for the revocation of membership based on sound reasoning

Membership Renewal:



- Steering Committee: MS to confirm nominations to SC every 2 years
- Chairing of SC will change as per SADC Troika
- Members: renew their membership every 2 years – otherwise auto-lapse

Portal implications:

- Any member can post content & start discussions online
- Discussions can be open or closed any member can be invited or request to be part of a discussion
- Steering Committee can use same facility to have closed discussions
- Administrators will continue to receive notifications of what is happening on portal & can contact SC in case of misconduct

- Constitute Steering Committee one name each from each MS group TFCA Focal Points?
